What's Up at OSLM

Dear Family and Friends of Our Savior,



January concluded with the Semi-Annual Stewards' Voters' Meeting on Tuesday evening. The assembly began with a devotion, pointing out the relationship between this year's theme verse ("May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him..." Romans 15:13) and our Vision Statement: Rooted in Grace, Growing in Faith, and Serving with Joy.

This week, we will consider how this helps us, and others, find the energy to meet the challenges of life and our Christian mission: Renewing Strength with Overflowing Hope (Isaiah 40:31).

The balance of the gathering consisted of electing members to the nominating committee, several presentations by the Chair, Dave Knapp, an update on the Fire-side Chats, and discussion of the finances.

Dave explained the plan to engage a new attorney for a new constitution and by-laws, presented the current Aspirations and metrics intended to illustrate progress toward desired outcomes, and revealed a new method of collecting and analyzing worship attendance, among other statistics and initiatives.

After a brief reminder of the process of our "Chats" for "Aligning our Vision" last winter, I shared some current results regarding worship, children's ministry, and Stephen's Ministry; and

Charlie Swift presented the "Silver Bag New Neighbor" ministry.

I concluded the meeting pointing out that current income is running below expenses. Our cash surplus from last year is covering the gap so far. The single biggest "line" that needs support is financial aid for students; thus, the purpose of the HOPE Scholarship Campaign. Contributions to that cause are a tangible way to accomplish our education mission while at the same time, making a difference in a child's life in Jesus' name. In addition to keeping expenses down, consistent contributions or increases in general giving will also make a difference.

May the God of Hope fill you with all joy and peace,

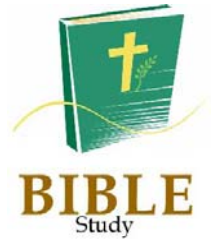

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) classes are taught by Livermore-Pleasanton Fire Department and prepare you to help your family, neighborhood or community in the event of an emergency or disaster.

The CERT program has been active since 1996. The all-hazards curriculum was developed in 1986 by the Los Angeles City Fire Department, incorporating lessons learned from citizen responses to disasters around the globe.

What Emergency Managers have learned is that ordinary citizens will step up to help during disasters. But without training, they can become victims themselves. The CERT program gives citizens the tools to stay safe, protect their families, and respond to neighbors in need.

Booster Seat Law



The Booster Seat law has changed with the beginning of the year. This new law defines very specifically what "properly buckled" with the vehicle seat belt is for children over the age of 8.

Most kids will not fit in the seat belt properly until between the ages of 10-12 years old which coincides with when they reach 4'9" - the height when the vehicle belt begins to fit properly. Of

course, the law does make exceptions for some situations, i.e. the child is over 4'9" and under 8 years old, but these children are in the minority. Many parents might find this law inconvenient. While boosters may be inconvenient, they do so much to help protect our kids... Children seated in a booster seat in the rear of the car are 45% less likely to be injured in a crash as compared to those using a seat belt alone. To help you better understand this new law, we have attached a flier for your reference. Please be safe.

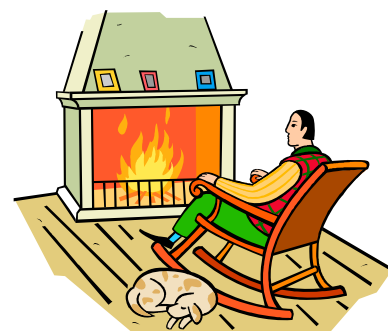
